The discipline has taught me that life is what you make it. I've had the opportunity to give back and volunteer at church and homeless shelters. It's through these lessons and experiences I decided that I had an interest in non-profit business administration. I plan to attend the University of South Dakota next year and will be one of the first in my family to attend college.
